- MMPA charging station










# Community Garden (City, SPU, Scott County)









## Mars/Hansen Utility Extension

#### Funding

- Lateral Connection Fee for H2O and sewer
- Option to petition and waive for 10-year special assessment of connection fees
- Fees include CPI inflation cost escalation

#### Connection

- O Voluntary but required when property is redeveloped, sold, or has system failure
- Timing options
  - Concurrent for both H2O and sewer at the same time
  - Non-concurrent and allow to connect independent of each other

#### Next steps

- Need consensus b/t city and SPU on connection and funding
- Proceed with final design and construction
- o Public outreach
- State funding and loan applications
  - · Drinking Water Revolving Fund
  - Clean Water Revolving Fund
- Establish lateral preliminary connection fees for H2O and sewer to be finalized upon completion
- Bidding in late 2021/22




