

## Temporary Water Meter Terms and Charges

### Agreed Upon Terms

1. Hydrant meters are to be used only when access to a permanent, metered water source is not readily available.
2. Hydrant meters are to be used for construction purposes only. A potable water supply, irrigating of any type, filling of pools or flooding of ice rinks are not acceptable uses.
3. Applicant must ensure proper cross control measures are taken at all times (air gaps on water tanks, vacuum breakers on hose bibs, RPZ's, double check valves, etc.)
4. The hydrant meter must be accessible to SPU for meter readings when requested.
5. A copy of this permit must be present and accessible when taking water.
6. This Temporary Water Use Permit expires on November 15th of the year it was issued. No water can be taken from any hydrant after this permit has expired without prior approval from SPU.
7. Hydrant meters and all accessories are to be returned to SPU no later than December 1<sup>st</sup> of the year it was issued.
8. This permit can be revoked by SPU at any time.

### Agreed Upon Charges

1. A permit fee of \$50.00 is required. Permits expire annually on November 15th. (See Terms.)
2. In addition to the permit fee, a \$250 deposit (3/4") or \$1,000 deposit (2-1/2") is required before meter and permit are issued. (Deposit to be refunded upon confirmation of undamaged hydrant use and the return of all undamaged equipment issued, minus any use charges.)
3. Equipment (including hydrants, meters and/or accessories) that is damaged or not returned is subject to a repair or replacement charge.
4. A minimum monthly, temporary water use charge of \$75.00 (up to 10,000 gallons) will be assessed each month, or portions thereof, until meter is returned.
4. Water usage in excess of 10,000 gallons each month will be charged \$3.13 per 1,000 gallons of water taken.
